***With so many huge expectations, the Orioles became an injury riddled ball club, sinking to last place of the AL East sporting a record of 15-28, 10 ½ games out of first, May 17th. Two years after winning the AL Manager of the Year Award, eyebrows were raised when skipper Brandon Hyde, who had brought the team so far, was sacked. He was replaced by third base coach Tony Mansolino for the interim...The leftfield distance was toyed with again to nearly where it had been, but nevertheless, the O's boasted eight sluggers with double figure home run totals. Jackson Holliday, Gunnar Henderson and Jordan Westburg tied for the lead with 17 each. Henderson had the most RBI (68)...The pitching staff ended the year with two double-digit winners: Dean Kremer (11) and Tomoyuki Sugano (10)...The Orioles used 70 players during the season, tying a Major League record.**
