Following an unceremonious eviction from the decaying Oakland Coliseum, the ball club now known temporarily as the ATHLETICS, plopped down in Sacramento, the home of the San Francisco Giants AAA affiliate. Sutter Health Park, no where near major league standards, had to do for the 768.5 thousand fans who came to watch the A's. They were treated to the arrival of the AL Rookie of the Year, Nick Kurtz, who in 117 games and 420 at bats, belted 36 homers, drove in 86 runs, and finished the season with an 1.002 OPS and .619 slugging percentage. He played a nifty first base as a bonus. The wunderkind tallied enough votes to place 12th in MVP balloting. The team hit .253 and popped 219 homers. Tyler Soderstrom, a very valuable asset in his own right, hit 25 home runs and led the A's in RBI (93). Twenty-three year old All Star shortstop Jacob Wilson was a sight-to-behold as well, coming to play with slick defensive abilities to go with 13 jacks and 63 RBI. He ended the year with a slash of .355/.444/.800. He was second to Kurtz for Rookie of the Year. Backstop Shea Langeliers had another very productive season, slugging 31 homers and driving home 72. Lawrence Butler tagged MLB pitching for 21 home runs. Brent Rooker added 30 more, compiling an .814 OPS...Jeffrey Springs won 11 games, the most of the starting staff while closer Mason Miller, prior to a trade to the Padres, whiffed 59 batters in 38 innings pitched...The front office signed manager Mark Kotsay to a deserved a three-year contract extension through 2027...An 11-game losing streak, May 14th through the 24th, sank any hopes for contention. They were out-scored 85-35 in that span...The A's won 40 games on the road, 36 at home.
