A new season of Cardinals baseball did not get off to an auspicious start. On April 6th, at Boston, they lost a walk-off ballgame in the tenth inning, the first game of a make-up twin-bill. The Red Sox demolished the pitching staff in an 18-7 laughter in Game 2. In the second inning of the nightcap, the Bosox poured five runs across the plate, but in the third, Alex Bregman slammed a three-run homer as part of a four-run inning. The Red Sox third baseman, late of the Astros, had nine total bases in the game along with six RBI and two doubles. By the ninth, it was 18-4. In the two games, the Cardinals left 23 men on base. After a 14-17 April, things began to nicely pick-up. A 19-8 May sent them flying into second place of the NL Central Division, only three games out of first. At the end of June, they were third but still three games back. The month of July ended with eight wins in twenty-four ballgames, knocking them out of contention. They settled into fourth place July 23rd and nested there the rest of the season...Catcher Willson Contreras transitioned to first base full time. It didn't stall his production in the batter's box. He posted a team high 20 home runs and 80 RBI. Trailing him were Ivan Herrera (19 HRs, 66 RBI) and Alec Burleson (18 HRs, 69 RBI). Whippet Victor Scott II was among the top ten in stolen bases in the big leagues and caught everything hit his way as the new everyday centerfielder...Sonny Gray won the most games (14) and struck out the most batters (201) to lead the pitching staff...Infielder Thomas Saggese's last name is pronounced soo-JAY-see...The usually speedy Red Birds accounted for only nine triples the entire year.
