In the aftermath of a terrific 2024 campaign during which new manager Stephen Vogt returned the Guardians to World Series contention, Cleveland stumbled out of the gate in 2025 while AL Central Division rival Detroit sprinted to a 38-21 record by the end of May to lead the division by six games. By the All Star break, the Guardians trailed the Tigers by 12 games and had dropped to third place. The deficit had been, at the most, 15 ½ games the week before. The season's second half was nearly the opposite. With the Guardians gaining momentum, finding their game, the Tigers now were huffing and puffing to keep pace. The division lead was likely decided in September when the two teams met head-to-head. The Guardians dominated, winning five of six games. Thus, it all came down to the last day of the year. Cleveland beat Texas 9-8 in ten innings, Detroit lost at Boston, 4-3. The Guardians won the division title by one game. The tables turned once again as the two arch-rivals faced off in a best-of-three Wild Card series. Despite all three games on the Guardians home turf, the Tigers took the series two games to one...Jose Ramirez, at age 32, finished third in league MVP voting after a season in which he hit 30 homers, drove in 85, and achieved a career-high in stolen bases. His total was 83 over the past two years, including 69 homers and 203 RBI. Kyle Manzardo followed with 27 dingers and 70 RBI. The ball club hit .226 and 168 home runs...The pitching staff was very good (3.70 ERA) if not excellent. Tanner Bibee and Gavin Williams both led the staff with 12 wins each. In August, pitchers Emmanuel Clase and Luis Ortiz were suspended and lost for the remainder of the year after being charged with illegal gambling--betting on baseball. An investigation into their alleged wrongdoing had started in July. In Clase's absence, Cade Smith did a yeoman's job as closer. Lefty Parker Messick was greatly impressive after being called up in August.
