The Padres and Dodgers tangled once again, fighting like two mighty lions for one's territory, intensifying the heat of their rivalry. After San Diego sprinted out of the box with a 15-4 start to the year, the two teams scratched and clawed their way through the season, the Dodgers occupying first place in the NL West for the majority of the time. San Diego held the top spot (or tied) for 27 calendar days, the last in a tie with L. A., August 24th. The closest they came to the Dodgers was one game in early September... At the All Star break, their deficit had been 5 ½ games in second place. The Dodgers won the season series, 9-4... Qualifying for the post-season in four of the last six seasons, the Padres would fail to advance in the 2025 playoffs, after falling to the Cubs in a Wild Card series, two games to one... The offense featured plenty of power with the likes of Manny Machado leading the way with 27 homers and 95 RBI. Fernando Tatis Jr., winner of his eighth Gold Glove, caught nearly every flyball headed his direction and contributed 25 home runs and 71 RBI... The pitching staff's ERA was the second best in the big leagues (3.63). Nick Pivetta's 13 wins were the highest number of the group. He struck out 190. Dylan Cease was eight up and twelve down, but whiffed 215 batters. Robert Suarez's save total was second in the majors.
