Pitcher Paul Skenes should receive more accolades than anyone from the Pirates ball club. The twenty-three year old simply gets opposing hitters OUT, whether it be via the fastball or whatever he's concocted for that day. The National League Cy Young Award winner finished with a 1.97 ERA, a .948 WHIP, and 216 strikeouts. For now, he's in Pittsburgh. Who knows what the future is for this gem...In his sixth year as manager, Derek Shelton was fired 38 games into the season (12-26). He was replaced by the bench coach and former Bucco utility man, Don Kelly. Shelton, lifetime, was 306-440 (.410) at the helm. He never finished above fourth...After eight games, the Bucs had fallen to the bottom of the NL Central Division, the spot they maintained the remainder of the year. They DID win 32 of 55 games in the season's second half...Oneil Cruz, a converted centerfielder, plays that position but somewhat unskillfully. Blessed with great speed, he led the N. L. in stolen bases and the Pirates with 20 homers. Bryan Reynolds, after a slow start, hit well enough to end the year totaling 16 home runs. He led the team with 38 doubles and 73 RBI. Cruz was next with 61. Andrew McCutchen, probably having played his last game as a Pirate, hit 13 homers, driving in 57...For all his superlative work on the mound, Skenes ended the season 10-10. Despite a respectable ERA of 4.19, Mitch Keller was a losing pitcher 15 times. Closer David Bednar was dealt to the Yankees at the trade deadline for essentially three minor leaguers.
