Amongst a change in ownership and the back-and-forth talk of a new stadium, it took Hurricane Milton to tear the roof off Tropicana Field to possibly speed up the new ballpark progress. Thus, the Rays became orphans so to speak in October 2024, working out an agreement to play the 2025 regular season at George M. Steinbrenner Field, the home of Yankees' spring training for eons. It wasn't great, but it would do as cash needed to be found and repairs to the Rays permanent home got underway...In their new digs, the Rays showed a lot of offense, Junior Caminero's 45 homers and 110 RBI leading the pack. Brandon Lowe cracked 31 round-trippers followed by Yandy Diaz's 25. Both drove home 83 runs. The team batting average ended at .251 with a home run total of 182...Ryan Pepiot won the most games on the pitching staff (11). Three others won at least ten games: Shane Baz, Drew Rasmussen, and reliever Edwin Uceta. Baz was a strikeout machine (176). Rasmussen did not pitch enough innings to earn a spot in the group of major league ERA leaders...Tampa Bay reached as high as 11 games over .500, June 28th. On that date, they were in second place of the AL East, ½ game out of first. From there, the rest of the year was a downer. The Rays rounded out the schedule 30-49, suffering a humbling tumble to finish fourth for the second straight season.
