Minnesota Twins fans needed a scorecard for each game to keep track of all the comings and goings of personnel on the field throughout the season. With the front office telling disgruntled followers of the team it wasn't a salary dump, 11 players were traded to other locales, including much sought after closer, Jhoan Duran. Carlos Correa agreed to return to his old stomping grounds in Houston, saving the team a tidy 30 million or so. Ball clubs were even inquiring about shaking loose Byron Buxton despite a no-trade contract. Starter Joe Ryan was mistakenly reported to have been dealt to Boston. One highlight of the year the fans could tuck in their pocket was a 13-game winning streak, the second most since the franchise had relocated from Washington in 1961. It came from early to mid-May. Rocco Baldelli was relieved of his managerial duties after the season. Baldelli's seven year record: 527-505 (.511) with three post-season appearances...Buxton played in 126 games (second most of his career), posting a spectacular total of 35 homers and 83 RBI, both career highs. Matt Wallner contributed 22 home runs. Newcomer Kody Clemens (Roger's kid) tacked on 19 more...The aforementioned Joe Ryan was the pitching staff's leader with 13 wins and 194 strikeouts...Luke Keaschall's last name is pronounced KEY-shull; pronounce DaShawn Keirsey Jr.'s last name as KEER-see.
